

## I think someone I know may have leprosy. What do I do?

Tell them not to be afraid. Leprosy is curable, and early treatment prevents disability.



Do not delay in getting treatment.

Go immediately to a Health Centre or Operational District (OD) Leprosy Supervisor.

**Kien Khleang Leprosy Rehabilitation Centre**, Phnom Penh, provides a variety of free services where leprosy patients can be referred; including ulcer and reaction care, education and reconstructive surgery. It also provides technical support and training for health professionals and students.

## How should we relate to someone who is being treated

There is no reason to exclude people who are being treated or have been treated in the past.



People who are being treated for leprosy should be encouraged to live, work and participate normally in all community events.
